Interprofessional Program In Integrative Healthcare

The Interprofessional Program in Integrative Healthcare is a nine-month in-depth course for physicians, nurse practitioners, and those in a healing or clinical profession with a Master's degree or above.

The program provides an overview of important modalities in integrative medicine as well as the integrative approach to common clinical problems. It includes biweekly interdisciplinary case conferences in which participants present cases from their own practices. This curriculum gives participants the knowledge needed to incorporate integrative approaches into both their clinical practice and their teaching activities.

The course meets from 3:00 pm - 5:00 pm on Tuesdays from September to June, starting September 15, 2020.

The cost of the program is \$2,400 for the full academic year. There is a reduced cost for Institute for Family Health and Mount Sinai employees. We encourage program graduates to continue to attend the weekly meetings and bring their clinical cases to our case conferences.

Curriculum Content

The program offers a mix of didactics and case conferences.

The didactics are divided between modality-based sessions covering specific therapeutic approaches and system/condition-based sessions demonstrating the application of these approaches to specific medical conditions. The presentations incorporate experiential and theoretical elements with frequent opportunity for questions and discussion.

The case conferences present a unique opportunity to discuss a range of cases with a multidisciplinary faculty which includes practitioners of allopathic medicine, traditional Chinese medicine, psychotherapy, naturopathy, and nutrition. Participants present cases from their own practices to gain feedback on how integrative approaches might apply. It often leads to further discussion of clinical topics. Faculty is rotated through the case conferences to ensure the presence of a diversity of disciplines and philosophies.
